

FROM THE PASTOR

We are living in a world of conflict. Many are pointing to the current politics in Washington D.C. as the source of the divisions in our country. While there is some truth in that, the fact is that conflict has been part of life since the beginning (read Genesis 3-11), and I don't see an end in sight. I also don't believe we just throw up our hands and give in. Reading Psalm 124 for my personal devotions recently, I was challenged to "Pray for the peace..." While the Psalmist prayed for the peace of "Jerusalem", I pray for the peace of Washington D.C. and our nation, for the world, for California and Clarksburg, for families and schools, and church, etc.

I pray, because the search for peace begins with God. Biblical peace, in Hebrew Shalom, is not simply a negative—no conflict, rather it is a positive-fulfillment and prosperity and justice for all sides. Human peace is generally one-sided and short-lived. We need the help of the One who is righteous and just and wise. So begin with prayer and humility.

Peace also has to begin inside, for it is a spiritual state of the heart and mind. The world is not at peace because people are not at peace. We are quick to point out the faults of others, but unable or unwilling to confront the internal source of our own conflicted souls. Jesus

promises "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give you". (John 14.27)
One of the great prayers of the church comes from Sir Thomas More, 5 centuries ago, "Lord, give me patience in tribulation, and grace in everything to conform my will to Thine....the things, good Lord, that I pray for, give me the grace to labor for." So, as I pray for peace, I also want to be a peacemaker (Matthew 5.9) where and when I can.

I don't think we are going to get all sides to agree on all things. But, I can be more intentional about not needlessly throwing gas on the fire and instead, seeking common ground and understanding. At the same time, we must not compromise our own beliefs, yet find ways to differ while, if possible, living in peace with all people (Romans 12.18)
