FROM THE PASTOR

On several occasions while teaching, Jesus said of himself, "The Son of Man must be lifted up." **Holy Week** is the time of year when the church focuses on the One who was lifted up.

Palm Sunday begins the week, when Jesus, riding on a donkey into Jerusalem, publicly declared himself to be the Messiah/Christ foretold by the Old Testament prophets. He was lifted up, that is exalted, by the people singing his praise and shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David." They recognized him as the promised king who was to come to save his people and establish his reign of justice and peace. That day is also called **Passion Sunday**, because Jesus did not pursue an earthly throne, but instead chose the way of the cross.

Later that week, Jesus shared a Last Supper with his apostles on what we call **Maundy Thursday**. Maundy means commandment, and we first remember and lift up his teaching ministry, best summed up in his command to love one another. It was at that Last Supper Jesus instituted the sacrament of communion, so we also, remember and lift up his life of sacrificial love which brought to earth forgiveness and salvation.

On **Good Friday**, Jesus was literally lifted up on the cross. Jesus made it clear that the cross was not the low but the high point of his life because that is what he came to do and what he lived for. While being nailed to and dying on the cross was extremely difficult for him and he suffered intensely, it was not tragic. In fact, he was able to declare, just before he breathed his last, "It is finished." When he was lifted up on the cross, he was able to accomplish his greatest victory.

On **Easter**, better known as Resurrection Day, Jesus was exalted by being raised up from death to eternal life. He was finally lifted up to be the Lord of all and to take his proper place on the throne of the eternal kingdom of God, where he is praised and worshipped now and forever. He is the Lord of life! Hallelujah! Amen and amen.



Meeting at the church at noon, join us for a gathering of friendship, fellowship and great food.


PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE – UPDATE
