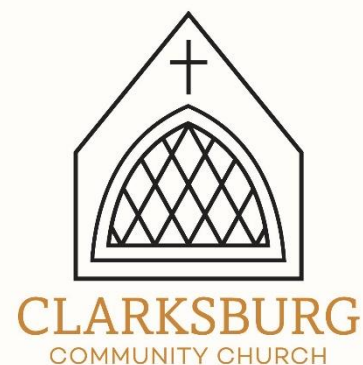


“Chiming in” with Pastor Sandy

Did you know there are over 400,000 local churches in the United States? With each one having their own style, identity, personality, values and mission it can be challenging to stand out. Most churches want to reach new people, so marketing becomes part of a local congregation’s outreach strategy. While that may sound more commercial than Christian our spiritual forefathers used the resources of their time to spread the Gospel and incorporated symbols, like the cross, to represent the faith to the general public. In the 20th-century, denominations and local churches created logos for promotional and printed materials. Now, it is commonplace to see local church signs, letterhead and websites complete with logos.

Last summer, we commissioned a local graphic artist to create our own logo with the goal of incorporating it on our promotional, printed and digital materials. While this sounds like an easy process, it actually took several months to complete. The design chosen incorporated the sanctuary window facing Netherlands Road, with the gold in the font matching our small sign on the corner of Netherlands and School Street.



One thing I have learned about the members of Clarksburg Community Church in the past year and a half is they are proud of their church, and rightfully so. Hopefully, our new logo will not only continue to instill a sense of holy pride, but also help promote unity in the church, connect with our community and reach people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
