FROM PASTOR EMERITUS DENNIS

One of the best known quotes of Benjamin Franklin, written by this founding father of our country almost two and a half centuries ago and yet still current, concludes, "...in this world nothing can said to be certain, except death and taxes." Franklin's cynical and humorous quip summarizing the human experience of constant change and uncertainty is often quoted and still relevant today. King David, whose dynasty would establish and lead Old Testament Israel and finally produce Christ Jesus, the Lord and Savior of the world, suggested a different approach to life when he proclaimed thirty centuries ago, "the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever." (Psalm 117) God's faithfulness is a certainty, now and forever. David put his faith and trust in that certainty, and whatever changes and uncertainty we face, we can always know with certainty that God will always be faithful to his people and his covenant of love. As the Israelites experienced the fall of their city and nation and world as they knew it, the prophet Jeremiah reminded them, "Yet this I call to mind and therefore have hope: because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. Serving at the UGM Women's Clothing Closet

As many of you know, I have been serving at the Women's Clothing Closet for over 8 years. I spend my Thursday mornings shopping with women of all ages, sizes, economic backgrounds, the homeless, the working poor, the mentally ill, the addicts. The list goes on and on. We never know who will be walking through our doors to shop for clothing, toiletry items, blankets, tarps, tents, diapers, shoes, socks, backpacks, rolling suitcases, etc. Sometimes, we meet women who just need a few things to get by. Sometimes, we meet women who are grandmothers that are now raising their grandchildren. Sometimes, we meet working poor women and their children who need clothes for school, clothes for a job interview. And sometimes we meet women who touch our hearts whom we worry about, we pray with, we cry for and sometimes we cry with.

One such woman came to the closet a few weeks ago. As I brought in another group to shop, I noticed her sitting on a bench outside our door, with a beautiful baby, sound asleep in her stroller. When it was her time to come in and shop, I spent most of the time shopping for clothing for her baby. As the other shoppers left, this young mom was still in the shop. I finally heard her story. She had just gotten off of a bus from another town a few hours away. She left a very abusive relationship and due to her culture, she could not turn to her family for help. She had no one to help her and she arrived with merely the clothes on her back and minimal clothing and diapers for the baby. The shop was closing, but we did not want to turn this young mom away. We know what could happen to her out on the street. As we gathered around her, heard more of her story, fed her lunch and gave her a quiet place to nurse the baby, we prayed for her and the Lord started working within us. The three of us started making calls to the usual places, like WEAVE, Salvation Army, Mary's House, etc. We were all told them same thing: She has to come in, fill out paperwork and get on a waiting list. There are no beds available. So we reached out to our contacts, who then gave us other contacts. Still, there are no beds available. As we were planning our next move, to put her in motel for a few nights, Josephine, another volunteer, remembered a woman she met years ago who is of the same culture. Josephine called her and explained the situation. This woman immediately got into her car, came over to the UGM and picked up the young mom and baby and took them home with her to keep them safe, fed and a place to sleep while helping her get her paperwork in order. She is still at this woman's house and she is safe.

I tell this story merely to explain that we never know what situation we will be dealing with any given Thursday morning at the Women's Clothing Closet. It is truly humbling, uplifting and awesome to see the Holy Spirit working in us, God's instruments, when serving others. Please keep these women and children in your prayers and also the "angels" that the Lord sends to lend a helping hand and a loving heart.
